About You

As Temporary Staff Attorney, you'll work with a supervising senior immigrant justice attorney and the asylum program team to provide high-quality representation for asylum seekers, mentor pro bono attorneys, and participate in the development of training materials and resources to support pro bono representation in removal proceedings. The ideal candidate will have experience representing asylum seekers in removal proceedings, and a strong commitment to working with immigrants and advancing the immigrant rights movement. This position is to cover an employee's three-month sabbatical, with a little overlap for transition.

Your Work

- Training and mentorship (60%) Provide training, technical assistance, and mentorship to pro bono attorneys handling applications for asylum and other forms of humanitarian relief. Develop training materials, practice advisories, and ongoing programmatic improvements for the Pro Bono Asylum Program.
- Representation (25%) Represent asylum seekers and unaccompanied minors with
 cases pending before the Executive Office for Immigration Review (EOIR) and United
 States Citizenship & Immigration Services (USCIS). Manage a docket of direct services
 cases in various stages of representation, including communicating with clients
 regarding their pending cases, responding to notices or requests from the court and
 USCIS, filing changes of address forms, work permit applications, and affirmative
 applications for relief with USCIS.
- Support with screening and assessment of potential clients (15%) Conduct and review intake assessments to identify asylum cases that are good candidates for pro bono placement, review case memos prepared by law clerks and program coordinator to issue-spot for claims and to help summarize the best legal strategy for relief.

Essential Qualifications

- J.D. and a member in good standing of any state bar (*California strongly preferred).
- Minimum of two years of experience working as an immigration attorney with low-income communities and/or recent survivors of trauma.
- Strong bi-lingual (English and Spanish) language competency, including the ability to write basic correspondence in Spanish (*bi-cultural preferred).
- Strong problem-solving and analytical skills.
- Excellent organizational, communication, analytical, writing, and editing skills; strong attention to detail.
- Ability to work as a member of a team and independently. Ability to set and carry out objectives and prioritize workflow with minimal supervision.
- Ability to effectively work and communicate with diverse groups of individuals, including representatives of government, the private bar, and grassroots organizations.

Preferred Qualifications

- Substantial experience representing asylum seekers in removal proceedings before the San Francisco Immigration Court.
- Experience mentoring, training, and/or working collaboratively with pro bono attorneys.
- Values working collaboratively with others, both within the organization and in the community.

Salary, Benefits, Work location

This position is full-time, exempt, with a starting hourly rate of \$46-52/hr DOE and reports to the Immigrant Justice Senior Staff Attorney. Full benefits package includes 100% paid medical + 80% for dependents, phone and internet reimbursement, vacation, sick time, paid holidays, short Fridays, and a 2-day wellness spring break in conjunction with the Cesar Chavez holiday (March 31 to April 4, 2023).

Our office is located on the Embarcadero in downtown San Francisco, close to many transit options. We're currently remote with our office available for optional use, or as needed. We do not yet have a target date for return to the office, but we expect to offer, at minimum, part-time remote. While remote, may not work outside CA for more than 30 consecutive days at a time. Employees must be fully vaccinated according to CDC COVID-19 guidelines for inperson work.

General working hours are 9am-5pm, M-F. LCCRSF is woman- and minority-led, with 32 staff. We are flexible, family-friendly, and value health, wellness and balance. We follow ADA guidelines - reasonable accommodation may be made to enable individuals with different abilities to perform the essential functions.

Physical Demands

- Able to work on a computer (keying, typing, attending Zoom calls and virtual meetings), including sitting at a desk, for extended periods of time with or without reasonable accommodation
- Manual dexterity to operate a keyboard
- Able to see or read a computer screen and printed material with or without vision aids
- Able to speak clearly and in audible tones on the phone and in person and be understood by others
- Able to hear and understand speech at normal levels and on the telephone
- Able to understand and follow oral and written instructions
- Able to occasionally lift objects weighing up to 10 pounds
- Employees are required to be fully vaccinated and comply with HIP's COVID-19 health and safety measures consistent with CDC guidelines, and federal, state, and local regulations during in office and other in person work
